# Trash to Music

This year we are excited to include “found-sound” in the Schools T2F Awards. Rhythm artist Fraser Bruce has launched a new rhythm based project called Trash to Music.

Very simply the idea is for students to

1. Acquire articles, parts, or combinations of things like wood, metal, plastics, glass that may have had a previous life,
2. Explore all the different ways these can make sounds,
3. Work out how to manipulate these sounds for tonal colour/pitch difference etc
4. Determine which sounds might go well together.
5. Create small compositions as a solo or ensemble
6. Perform and record these.

## Aims

- to inspire awareness of recycling and reusing resources
- to involve Music students at schools in an innovative and exciting project to stimulate their imaginations, resulting in unique musical instruments and music being created
- to bring together different schools/students in a common project
- to link Music students at schools with the Textile Technology students
- to provide professional community musicians to schools as additional mentors for the school Music programmes

The best “trash” compositions will be selected to be performed as part of the Schools T2F Awards events which will occur between September 5 and 13 2009.

There will also be support provided by the Auckland Philharmonic Orchestra’s Composer-in-Residence Chris Adams, and various members of the orchestra

All of this will result in an exciting collaborative project that is set to become an annual community event designed to show case artistic and innovative use of our resources.
